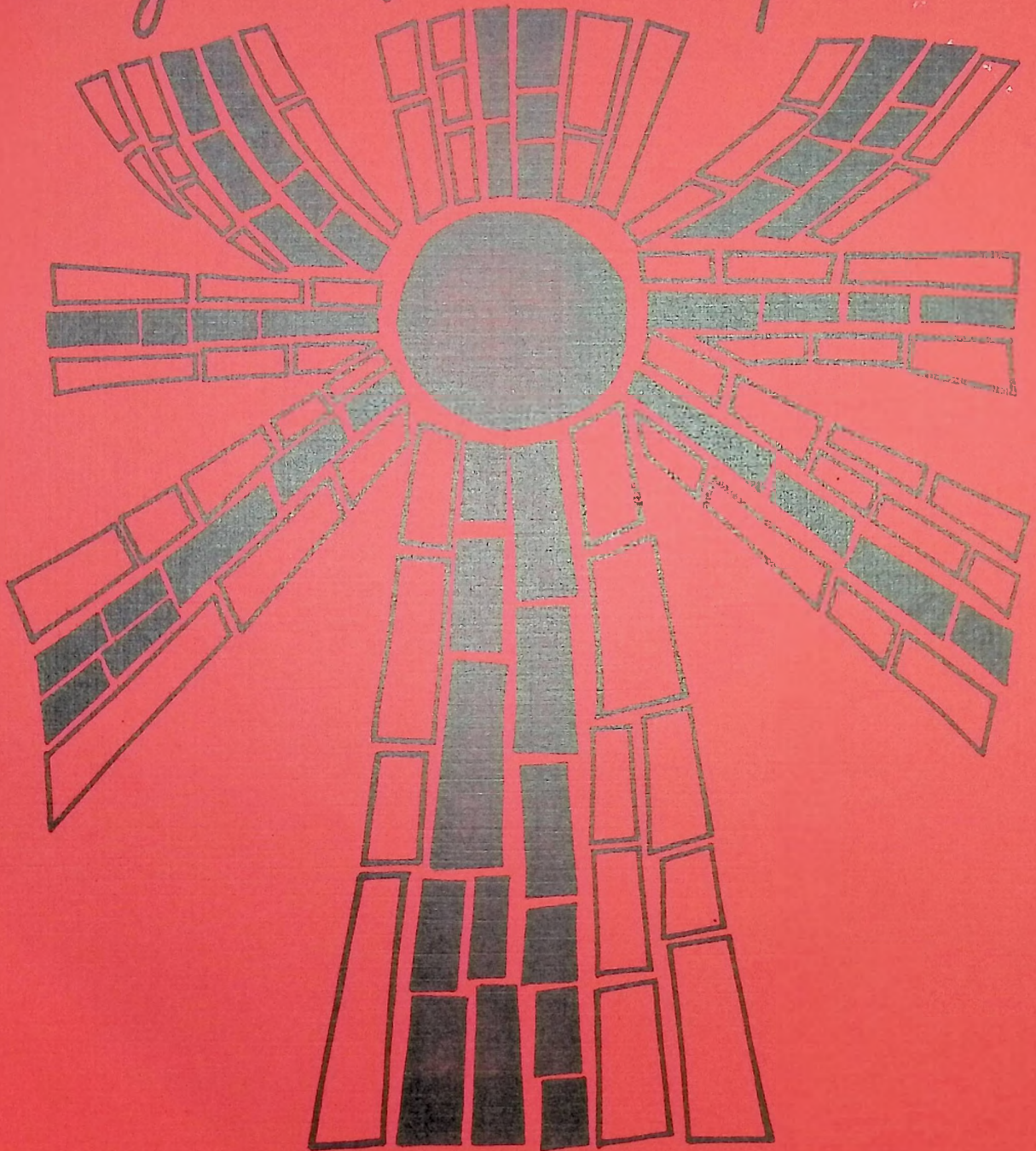


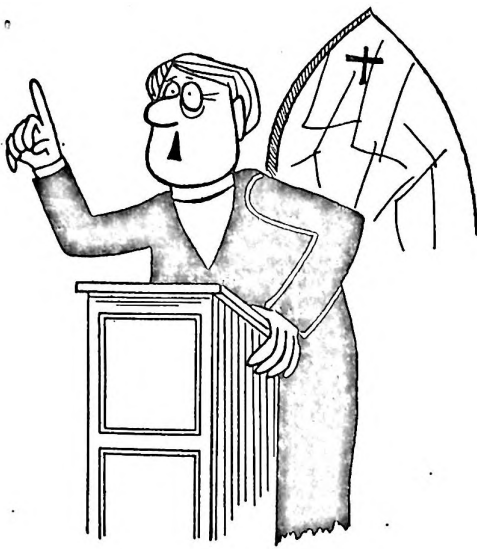

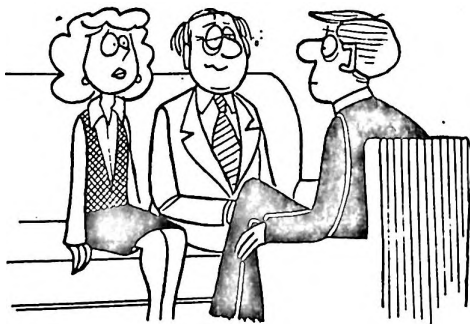
PASTORAL REPORT

The year in review . . .

1. We finally received notice that our application for sponsorship of CROSSROADS at Saint Luke Senior Center was approved by the New York City Department for the Aging. Funds were appropriated in excess of \$ 135,000 for the program. A gala Dedication and Open House was held to officially take notice of the transfer of sponsorship from Project FIND to Saint Luke's.
2. FRIENDS of SAINT LUKE once again proved to be more than mere friends . . . they are, indeed, co-sponsors of our presence here at Times Square. Gifts from Friends funded Vicar Mokry's service through the contract period, the end of August. Zion Lutheran Church, Wausau, Wisconsin, provided all of the funds for the Vicar's two-year internship at Saint Luke's. In addition, Friends enabled us to subsidize our door ministry/benevolence work, our Spanish ministry program, and provided over \$ 15,000 (including Benefit receipts) to wipe out 1980's deficit. What good and blessed Friends we have!
3. The resignation of our super, Wayne Porter, set in process quite a search for a replacement. We have finally and hopefully a permanent super, Mr. Bela Marics, a refugee from Hungary. We have placed him on full salary in lieu of no longer furnishing an apartment for a live-in super. He will work 35 hours per week and provide his own housing.
4. Candidate Robert N. Splittgerber was interviewed by Pastor Hansen for the position of Director of CROSSROADS at Saint Luke. He was subsequently recommended to the Department for the Aging for approval and called as Assistant PASTOR of Saint Luke's. Ordained by Bishop Harold Hecht, of the English Synod, AELC, he was installed by Bishop John Hinsch on December 14. Pastor Splittgerber will serve primarily with CROSSROADS, but will assist in the pastoral ministry.
5. The American Lutheran Publicity Bureau, an historic servant of Lutheranism in this country, was seeking office space and Saint Luke's has welcomed them to our facility. The ALPB is a publisher of tracts and religious materials for Lutheran churches, and is the publisher of THE LUTHERAN FORUM newsletter. Pastor Glenn Stone is the executive secretary of the Bureau. Their office is in the former Vicar's office, with auxiliary work space in the adjacent storage room and classroom, on third floor.
6. The Dorcas Guild and the Ladies Aid Society underwrote the costs of the remodeling of the Ladies Room on the first floor. New ceramic tile walls, a new ceiling and light fixtures, mirrors and paint job have created a welcome improvement to the properties. Thanks!

7. Mathilda Theurer sponsored the restoration of the church sign above the Senior Center entrance . . . gold leaf lettering re-done and a very new-looking sign visible from Eighth Avenue . . . thank you, thank you!
8. Richard Barris, with some help from the basketball team, completely re-finished the gymnasium floor and painted the walls and wain-scoting. The gym looks like new! Our thanks to those who helped restore that area to tip-top condition.
9. The House Committee authorized installation of storm glass and repairs to the stained glass windows at the east exit of the sanctuary, repairs and replacements to the gutters and downspouts along the east side of the sanctuary, and the painting of the rectory.
10. Agreements have been worked out with a number of organizations and groups using Saint Luke's facilities for contributions/use fees. We anticipate realizing over \$ 20,000 in 1981, greatly assisting us in meeting skyrocketing utilities costs.
11. Our parish worker, Christopher Greene, worked on a 25-hour per week schedule since beginning at Saint Luke's last year. Because of increased use of our facilities and program-needs, the Trustees are recommending that he be offered a full-time position. Mr. Greene will coordinate volunteers serving in various capacities for church activities, supervise custodial staff, schedule building use, direct Sunday School and Summer Vacation Bible School programs, assist with outreach/evangelism efforts, and manage the church office.
12. A new office was built in the arts/crafts room for our bookkeeper/treasurer of CROSSROADS and Saint Luke's, Walter Gausman. Financial records are kept there and ample work space was created for central-izing equipment and records of both Senior Center and the parish.
13. New park benches were purchased for the gardens, enabling our Senior Center members and friends to get greater use of the area.

SOME GOALS FOR 1981:

1. Facilitate our outreach through addition of Parish Worker and other pastoral assistance.
2. Develop an organized outreach to the Performing Arts Community.
3. Continue to encourage our members to reflect their commitment through stewardship and support of our congregation.
4. Begin planning for a sequel to "Miracle on 46th Street" and our appeal to Friends of Saint Luke for continued support.
5. Participate actively in plans for re-building our block, fostering adequate housing for low-income and elderly, and aggressive attention to problems of security and sanitation in the neighborhood.
6. Renovate rest room facilities in the church hall/CROSSROADS areas.
7. Repair and paint upper level windows and casings in the parish house.
8. Explore ways to conserve energy in the buildings: oil savings, electrical savings, water savings.
9. Involve more of our members in congregational service-activities, i.e., ushering, welcoming, helping with the Coffee House, hosting/monitoring the narthex and sanctuary during "open hours."

FROM OUR TREASURER



Dear Fellow-Members and Friends,

A year has gone by since I last reported to you. At that time we had a deficit of some \$ 11,000.00 after having received a \$ 10,000 contribution from our "Friends" account. We knew at that time that the year 1980 would present a greater challenge for us than the year we had just completed.

These expectations were correct. We spent \$ 7,000.00 more in 1980 than in 1979. While we show increases in most of our income accounts for the year, we were still in need of \$ 15,613.85 to cover all of our expenses. However, by combining the proceeds from our "Benefit" with our "Friends" account, we had sufficient funds to transfer this amount to our "Special Income" account and pay for all of our expenses. The last time that we were able to do this was in 1973.

We must now consider our needs for this year. We estimate our expenses will be \$ 7,700.00 higher than last year. In 1980 we had an increase in our envelope collections of \$ 2,300.00. With this in mind, we budgeted another \$ 3,000.00 increase for this year. The remaining \$ 4,700.00 we will attempt to raise through other means.

With your cooperation we can again accomplish our goals and support Saint Luke's in her ministry for our Savior.

Our thanks go to our pastor for his many endeavors to help our ministry. I also wish to thank all of you, both members and friends, for your continued assistance in supporting our mission. Thanks are extended to Mrs. Virginia Callahan and Miss Christine Gausman for assisting me during the past year.
