Dear Lukans . . . sisters and brothers in God's family in this place!

As 1992 gradually fades into history and as I survey the pile of Annual Reports that I've produced over nearly twenty years . . . I am amazed at how every year seems to have its peculiar baines and blessings, even as every year has had its moments of drama and deliverance. 1992 is no exception!

Many wonderful things happened in '92, not the least of which was the reception into our little family of twenty two "new Lukans" and our welcome to several "baby Lukans" at the font of God's Grace. It's different for us to hear the voices of little children chime in here and there in the Liturgy, some echoing our praises and others offering their cries of discomfort. The past few years we have been blessed with a growing number of couples and children, a phenomenon we haven't enjoyed in many years.

After what seemed to be a potential financial problem of significant dimensions, once again we under-estimated Who's in charge here! God's goodness rang through an outpouring of gifts from members and friends which enabled us to end the year in the black . . . and breathless! We even retired the indebtedness remaining from the renovation/restoration project and installation of our wonderful new pipe organ. Once again this old parson could only be awed by God's faithfulness and the generous response to his love by so many members and friends of Saint Luke's.

We did have our difficulties, though. The Director of our Senior Center resigned and left us in July. The NYC Department for the Aging began to investigate our Crossroads Senior Center and our Saturday Meals on Heels/Wheels programs, suggesting that improprieties in fiscal management would likely obligate the congregation for substantial unauthorized expenditures. After waiting since last August for City auditors to verify the accusations, and after our own careful search for culpability, we have as yet not received any definitive response from the Department for the Aging. But we have moved to tighten administration of the programs at every level. We asked Vicar Hutchens to assume the Directorship of the Center on a part time basis (he is also completing his seminary studies). Once again, God's goodness is evident in the efforts of the Vicar to turn things around and shape up the programs from one end to the other.

Meanwhile, we have applied for renewal of the contract for 1993-1996 for Crossroads at Saint Luke Senior Center. If the contract is awarded us once again, we have the added blessing of having Vicar Hutchens assigned to Saint Luke's for ordination and installation as Assistant Pastor, called to administer our social

service ministries as well as assist with our Word & Sacrament Ministry. He and Karen are excited about remaining with us and sharing in the unique ministries of this parish.

And what about 1993? I continue to live by growing faith in God's will and his blessing! We continue to require vigilance in our community efforts to help stabilize and improve living and working conditions for the thousands we serve. We need to be aggressively involved in outreach, evangelism, as we utilize a variety of approaches to getting the Good Word out. We continue to cope with a "revolving door" ministry at one level, folks who are here for some time and then move on in their vocations and places of residence. Happily, their faith-and-fellowship experiences at Saint Luke's will shine through their lives elsewhere.

My gratitude to the members and friends of Saint Luke's for continued love and encouragement, care and concern, effort and energy expended for the Glory of our Lord and the blessing of our Kingdom-outpost here at Times Square!!

During the year of 1992 our projects have continued pretty much along previous patterns, though we have added a few. The Ladies Aid Society funded the purchase of a computer for the church office for maintaining congregation records. We are also finally having some much-needed additional banisters installed at various levels of the Parish House stairways.

Our Cook Book is coming closer to a finished project. We are all anxiously awaiting its publication. We have Kathy Weber to thank for all of her diligent work to get it gathered, typed and into the hands of the printing company.

We continue to collect Campbell's labels and others for Bethesda Lutheran Home in Watertown, WI. To date we have sent 2,400 labels for their use in acquiring audio/visual equipment, library and computer-related items. The "tea bag" project is still going on. I contacted the elementary school teacher and learned they are now going into their "Two Million" tea-bag-goal. The students catalogue and segregate them. The Scott UPC seals are still being collected for the support of the Ronald McDonald Houses for children suffering from terminal illnesses and their families who come to be with them.

Cancelled stamps, foreign and U.S., are being sent off to the Mission Board, which sells them to raise funds in behalf of world outreach.

Used eyeglasses are also being collected and we have just sent off twenty one pairs to "Eyes for the Needy."

Our meetings are always open to any ladies of the congregation. We welcome you to come and join us. Meetings are held the second Sunday of each month after Coffee Hour, except during the summer.

I would like to heartily thank my fellow officers for all their assistance and support during the year. Their loyal help is truly appreciated . . . Elsie Reichert, vice president; Virginia Callahan, treasurer; and Gen Savio, secretary.
