Dear Sisters and Brothers . . . our Lukan family . . .

Our 143rd Year goes down in history as another "Miracle on 46th Street"! I never cease to be amazed how faithful and generous God is . . . and how little faith I (we) so often exercise. Two verifiable reasons support my thesis . . .

Last August I began pushing panic buttons. Not only we were experiencing the impact of the recession on our income from trust funds, but we had little choice but to install a new air conditioning unit for the Senior Center/Church Hall. One of the hottest summers on record challenged our old unit and did it in . . . after some thirty years of reliable service it simply gasped its last cold breath! The \$ 14,325 cost of the new unit and the fact that our request for help from the Department for the Aging brought only a smile as turned the other way . . . left us with the crisis of providing relief for our senior citizen guests or plummet them into torrid, uncomfortable surroundings.

Happily, you-all rose to both occasions! Your regular Sunday contributions soared to a record level, thereby alleviating the current budget crunch. And -- replacement of the air conditioning unit proceeded by borrowing from our trust funds . . . and ultimately repaying over half the cost by the end of the year! Hence, we hope to mop up the remaining debt during this year and next, "keeping our cool" and enjoying the wonderful reassurance that God never lets us down! So long as our motives are to serve him and people . . . we can count on him!

Now we have two other exciting propositions in the works. The possibility of our Bishop and the Synod Offices moving to Saint Luke's is still open . . . although mitigating factors may prohibit the move at this time. It appears that the Synod's present lease may not be as easy to break as was believed. The other exciting happening relates to the corner properties adjacent to the church. There are five buildings wrapping around the corner which have for years served as an SRO, most frequently housing a variety of very difficult persons. Now we have taken the first steps to acquire the properties (together with three other not-for-profit community agencies) and to completely rehab the buildings for really good use: twenty units would serve homeless persons, twenty units would be set aside for mentally ill persons on their way back to stable independent living, and twenty unites would house AIDS patients. Social services would be provided by our agencies. Decent, affordable, secure housing would be available for sixty persons with special needs. It will be a dream fulfilled . . . to re-cycle these buildings into blessed use for our new neighbors! Pending completion of funding it is hoped that work will begin by the end of this year and occupancy occur one year later.

We continue to experience "a revolving door" membership . . . with many folks coming for a year or two or three and then moving on. We have maintained our membership statistics despite a significant "migrant membership." Nevertheless, we treasure our current members and their participation in worship and service as we live out our Christian calling. I am profoundly grateful to Walter and Christine Gausman, who have so faithfully served us as Treasurer and Bookkeeper for some thirty plus years. Even as I am also grateful for Pastor Hutchens and Vicar Anderson for their loyal and faithful service to Saint Luke's and myself.

And, of course, I can only thank God for each of you and for your faith and fellowship in the Gospel. May God continue to give us joy in our worship, fellowship and service in this unique place, making our pilgrimage together cause for rejoicing!

## Treasurer's Report

As this is my last report to you as treasurer, I want to thank you for your cooperation in 1993, and also for your support and help during all my years as treasurer. It was a great privilege to serve in this capacity and I shall miss this work.

The year 1993 could be said to be a banner year as far as our finances are concerned. We ended the year with a balance of over \$ 13,000 in our receipts above expenditures. The Church Council then decided to transfer \$ 1,000 to our Mission Fund (ELCA Missions) and to retire the balance of owing (\$ 905.00) on our pledge to Trinity Lower East Side's building fund.

We ended the year with over \$ 11,000 in our Friends of Saint Luke program. We added \$ 30,000 to our investment portfolio (including a bequest from Mathilda Theurer of \$ 10,000).

You will find attached a balance sheet as well as a report on our Special Funds.

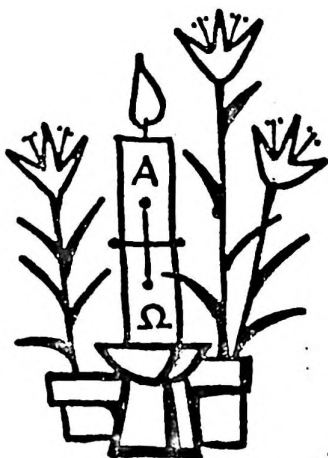

Despite a difficult and dismal past two years, Crossroads at St. Luke's is BACK, better than ever with a refreshing and new spirit. The staff and myself have worked very hard in making this center a warm and inviting place for seniors to spend the day. Dedication, quality, service, care and love are at the top of our priority list.

Over the past year our program has had an entire face lift. We have completely reorganized the fiscal and administrative components of the program. Thanks to Sonia our new fiscal office manager, our entire bookkeeping system is now computerized and in adherence to the regulations of the Department For the Aging. Sonia has been a real team player and has been one of the reasons for the successful turn around of Crossroads. Her experience and dedication as bookkeeper adds a bright outlook to a once bleak past.

Bids from Crossroads and an approved \$14,600. from DFTA enabled us to renovate all four restrooms which were in desperate need of attention. In addition monies were approved for a new set of doors leading to the side alley, as well as plumbing repairs in the kitchen. Thanks to St. Luke's Soup Kitchen Fund, we were able to purchase a new drinking fountain. Other improvements from Broadway posters, bulletin boards, to plants have enhanced the physical appearance of the Center creating a warmer environment for the seniors.

One of the highlights of our program this year has been the many and new exciting activities offered to the seniors. The new Senior Center Advisory Council, Snow, and I have made this a major focus to increase our membership. We offer weekly exercise and dance classes, movies, cable t.v. ping-pong, reading lounge, informational seminars, field trips, and even an extended menu with some "lip-smacking" entrees. Our new monthly news letter, "Crossroads News", has helped our seniors become aware of these up and coming activities, events and meals. The hard work has paid off; the seniors are excited and the daily attendance has increased.

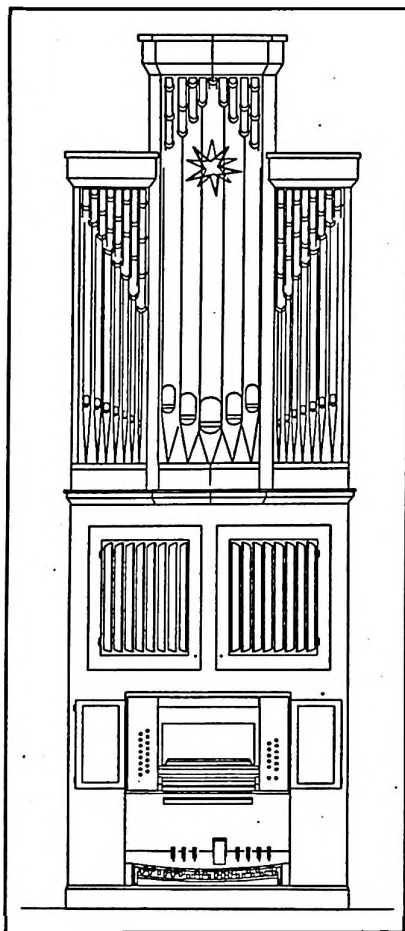

To this end, we are indeed fortunate to have a small but dedicated choir which enhances our corporate worship as they lead the congregation in hymn singing and the service music.

During the past year, the choir has offered its talents for approximately 40 Sundays and at seasonal services. Special music was presented for Easter, Reformation, All Saints' Sunday, and throughout the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany seasons. Once again, the choir outdid themselves at the now-annual Service of Advent Lessons and Carols. We look forward to continuing our fine tradition in the coming Church Year. And, as always, potential new members are encouraged to speak with the Director of Music at any time!

We are also fortunate to have an enlightened Worship Committee, which advises and assists the clergy and the Director of Music in the preparation and planning of worship events at Saint Luke's. Dear Members and Friends,

With the close of 1993 the Ladies Aid Society has continued most of the same projects in spite of the fact that our numbers have unfortunately not increased to any extent.

Our Ladies Aid Cookbooks are alive and well and to date have sold close to two hundred fifty copies . . . but we are still awaiting more buyers! Kathy Weber is to be complimented for their success. Some were sold at the Ninth Avenue Festival and we had a table at our November Flea Market.

The Society made a donation to the Building Fund for Trinity Lutheran Church, Lower East Side. The Campbell Labels are still be collected and we have recently sent in 3,002 to Bethesda Lutheran Home in Watertown, WI. They are used to acquire audio/visual equipment, library and computer-related items. The "tea bag" project is still going strong. When the weather clears up there will be a large number for the collectors, teacher and students at Teaneck School. Cancelled postage stamps are also being collected and sent on to a center in Washington D.C. which has a "Stamps for Missions" program. A goodly number of UPC seals from Scott Products were collected and sent for the support of the Ronald MacDonald Houses, which serve families of children suffering from terminal illnesses with a hospice to stay as they visit. We still also accept used eye glasses for the "Eyes for the Needy" program. The Ladies Aid also sponsors two Coffee Hours each month, on the first two Sundays of the month.

Ladies Aid members Helen Nisius and Toni Bettis co-chaired a Rummage Sale in June and a Flea Market in November. While these projects were all-congregation efforts, some of our members served as volunteers. Proceeds of the sales supported the parish's Friends of Saint Luke program. Our thanks to Helen and Toni for their leadership!

Our meetings are open to any ladies of the congregation and we certainly would welcome more of you to come and join us. Meetings are held on the second Sunday of each month after the Coffee Hour, with the exception of the summer months (and blizzards!).

My hearty thanks to my fellow officers for all their assistance and support during the year. Their loyal help is truly appreciated: Elsie Reichert, Vice President; Virginia Callahan, Treasurer; and Gen Savio, Secretary.
