Dear Sisters and Brothers,

What a year! 1994 and to date in 1995 have been times of testing for Saint Luke's. But we can thank God for sustaining presence and grace sufficient as we continue to cope with near-overwhelming challenges here at the Crossroads.

Several of our most faithful and generous members moved out of the City during this time. For those of us who remain, it is necessary for us to intensify our commitment to Christ's Cause through this congregation . . . both in terms of faithful participation and in the support that we offer our mission and ministry to this community.

Concluding ten years as Organist/Choirmaster, Steve Lawson resigned at the end of May. The Worship Committee carried out an intensive search for a replacement and was rewarded with the fine and capable successor, John W. W. Sherer. Mr. Sherer is a doctoral candidate in organ at the Julliard School. We welcome him to our ministerial team and look forward to his leadership of our music resources. His wife, Kara, teaches at St. Hilda's & St. Hugh's Episcopal School here in Manhattan.

Pastor Hutchens received and has accepted the Call of Christ Lutheran Church, Suffern, NY, to become their Pastor. His installation there is scheduled for March 26th. We are grateful to him and Karen for their three and a half years with us . . . as he matured from Vicar to Assistant Pastor! We send them on their way with our thanks and blessing.

After over thirty years as our parish treasurer Walter Gausman has retired. His service to us is inestimable . . . always faithful, precise, cooperative, caring, attentive . . . everything one wants in a treasurer! Walter deserves Saint Luke's profound gratitude for his long and sacrificial gift of talent and time! Finding a replacement has not been easy. Two of our members elected as treasurer announced they were moving to new jobs out of New York within a couple of months of their respective elections! Now Marvin Bettis has consented to serve (and stay in the City!). We are attempting to get all our financial records computerized and thereby not only more accessible, but also easier to maintain with a part time bookkeeper.

Early this year we also mourned the death of Christine Gausman, an unusually faithful servant of Christ. She handled the treasurer's duties for the former Dorcas Guild, the Ladies Aid Society, the Sunday School, the Metro New York Chaplaincy Auxiliary, and helped her brother, Walter, as assistant treasurer. . . posting all contributions, carefully keeping tabs on gifts to the Friends of St. Luke fund, and preparing quarterly statements for each member and an annual report for the Pastor. We are happy and grateful to Rowena Matzat for picking up some of the pieces, that of recording contributions and preparing quarterly statements.

Some bad news has come into focus over the past couple of months. Severe fiscal problems in our Senior Center have surfaced, requiring dismissal of our bookkeeper. We have had to retain legal counsel, hire an independent auditing firm to audit the past few years' Center books, and have also filed necessary police criminal reports. The extent of Saint Luke's liability is yet to be determined, but it may well be substantial. Meanwhile, these management irregularities together with the City's well-known budget cuts in all areas of human services, prompted the NYC

Department for the Aging to terminate our contract for the Center. They will integrate our Senior Center gradually over the next four months into the St. Malachy's Encore Senior Center at their site on 49th Street.

But there is some good news as well! We have entered into a relationship with the Times Square Consortium to sponsor (and house) a unique program serving homeless substance abusers on Times Square. The State of New York's Mental Health Department has given the Consortium a grant of over a half million dollars for this pilot project. Psychiatric social workers, an outreach team, and 24-hour security on site will attempt to prepare individuals for entrance into long-range rehab programs. The basement level of the parish house will be renovated to accommodate the program, providing space for housing seven clients and auxiliary needs. Project Renewal and Samaritan Village will operate the program, both agencies with long and good track records in rehabilitation of substance abusers.

Our ministries to the community and to transients with special needs continue to be a major part of our presence here. Saint Luke's also plays a vital role in sharing a Christian witness with the civic and corporate world around us. We are humbled by the challenges and opportunities which God presents this "little church off Times Square." Gratefully, our small spiritual family can be a blessing to multitudes because of God's abundant supply of daily grace and fervent faith.

God bless you for your fellowship in the Gospel and our mutual ministry in the Name of Christ!

## REPORT OF THE ORGANIST AND CHOIRMASTER

March 5, 1995

The ministry of music at Saint Luke's Church is committed to the goal of offering the best in sacred music for the spiritual growth of all people and for the glorification of God.

**Sing to the Lord and bless his name.**

*(Psalm 96:2a)*

The most important music at St. Luke's is the music of the community, and at each Sunday liturgy you, the congregation, sing with great joy and enthusiasm. The diversity of our hymnody is a testament to the timelessness and multi-culturalness of God's message. Each year we sing over 300 hymns, and use all three settings of the music for Holy Communion found in the Lutheran Book of Worship.

We are fortunate to have a talented and faith-filled choir, which nurtures congregational singing and provides over 80 anthems each year. Highlights of the past liturgical year have been Advent Lessons and Carols (which many said was the best ever) and Christmas Eve—and more is yet to come. The choral repertoire is very diverse, including Renaissance through Modern anthems, multi-cultural and multi-ethnic anthems, well-known anthems and some less familiar. The choir has grown as an ensemble, and every rehearsal is filled with hard work, joy, and laughter.

**Sing to the Lord with the harp, with trumpets, and the sound of the horn.**

Our magnificent Walcker organ is now five years old and is at the heart of all our music-making. Many instrumentalists have enhanced our festive occasions (and some not as festive), including a harpist, oboeist, and a brass quartet. A Kawai piano has recently been donated for the nave, which provides more musical possibilities for St. Luke's. In addition, I recently purchased a harpsichord and have placed it next to the organ for use at St. Luke's. In the near future we will be joined by a flautist, more brass, and a 100-voice choir from Iowa. If anyone plays an instrument, you are always welcome to play at St. Luke's.



Additional singers do join for Christmas and Easter, but the need for more singers is very real and urgent. We have four paid section leaders to assist the volunteer choir members, but volunteers should form the majority of the choir membership. If you enjoy music and enjoy sharing your talent, consider St. Luke's choir. We rehearse each Sunday morning from 9:00 to 10:30, beginning in the lounge. We particularly need sopranos and altos, but everyone is invited to join the choir. If you're unsure, try it for a limited time and then decide.

Future possibilities for enhancing choir membership include a music fundamentals class using the hymnal as a study guide and a rehearsal in addition to Sunday morning for those who may need extra time to learn an anthem. Any other suggestions on this subject would be welcomed.

Each week I look forward to working with the choir and I am thankful for each one of them. I am thrilled by the sound of the organ every time I play it, and am amazed at its flexibility. I am also thankful for the support of the Worship Committee and Pastor Hansen in all aspects of the music ministry at St. Luke's.

Dear Members and Friends,

For 1994 the Ladies Aid Society continued to carry on the same projects that we have been involved in as past years. Unfortunately, we have not grown in numbers as much as we would like. We do hope that we can arrange an OPEN HOUSE SUNDAY and invite some new LADIES and urge them to join in with us and even contribute new ideas to give us some new life.

Our Campbell soup and other label drive has continued and this year we have sent 466 and still collecting, for Bethesday Lutheran Home in Watertown, Wisc. From 1988 through 1994 we have sent 3259 along with 20 Plaid and Green Stamp Books. These are used toward the acquisition of audiovisual equipment, library, and computer-related items. The "tea tag" project is still going strong. We have had a noticeable drop in the number coming in since Christine Gausman's passing. She always collected them for us at her residence at mealtime. I take them over to an elementary school in Teaneck, N.J. The students in one of the lower grades, along with the teacher, count, sort, and classify them. They are always very excited when I come along with the bagful. We're still collecting and sending the canceled stamps to Washington, D.C., and then they are sent to Europe for missions.

I sent 120 UPC seals to Scott, and they pay 5 cents each toward the Ronald MacDonald Houses, which serve families of children suffering from terminal illnesses with a hospice to stay in while they are visiting.


We sent 24 pairs of used eyeglasses for the "Eyes for the Needy" program.

The ladies Aid Cook Books are still available.

The first two Sundays of each month are sponsored by the Ladies Aid for the coffee hour. Our meetings are held on the second Sunday of the month after the coffee hour, with the exception of the summer months.

My sincere thanks to my fellow officers for their assistance and support during the year. Their dedicated and loyal help is greatly appreciated: Toni Bettis, Vice President; Virginia Callahan, Treasurer; and Gen Savio, Secretary.
