Dear Sisters and Brothers . . .

I've been happy to bury old 1995! It was quite a year for Saint Luke's and for me personally. As most of you know we had to deal with a mountain of problems in our Senior Center, some of which are still not resolved. For the remainder of the year and up to the present and into the foreseeable future we are still crawling out from under fiscal mismanagement which resulted in the termination of our contract for Crossroads at Saint Luke Senior Center. Happily, the staff was all relocated and integrated into Encore at Saint Malachy's, a Senior Center on 49th Street.

We had to hire auditors to reconstruct the books for a two and a half year span. Several of our members put in many hours to gather information, assimilate mis-filed checks, reports and vouchers, thereby shaving off time otherwise required by the auditors. We have two years of records and reports finished and cleared. The final eight months of the contract are still in process . . . and indicate that this is where some of the larger problems lie.

Meanwhile, we bade farewell to Pastor Kurt and Karen Hutchens and family and to Vicar Phillip Gaines, who returned to Southern Lutheran Seminary. In September a new face appeared on the horizon -- Matthew Knip -- who joined our staff as parish administrator. Well known to many Lukans through his interim organist position here the summer of 1994, Matt brings special computer and liturgical expertise with him. And we bade farewell to Walter Gausman, who died in the Lord after a long illness. Walter I especially miss because of his faithful attention to our fiscal needs as Treasurer for over 35 years . . . and his handle on our economic condition.

We were blessed with the musical abilities and Christian faith of John Sherer, who brought new life to our choir and music ministry. With John's outstanding talent I knew that he would go on to "higher places" . . . and, indeed, he leaves us today to assume his new position as Director of Music for The Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago. We send John and his wife, Kara, on with our gratitude and our blessing.

In July the Project Renewal Respite Center settled into their renovated quarters on the ground level of the parish house. For security purposes a glass-enclosed doorway was installed at the stairs leading down to the Center. A faithful staff serves persons who are chronic substance abusers and homeless on Times Square. In August we welcomed the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services and Interfaith Services to our third floor office complex. They serve persons who need assistance with documentation, resettlement, education, legal problems, etc. A full-time staff of six has been supplemented with part-time legal counsel and some interns to meet the needs of a growing list of clients.

The Soup Kitchen continues to perk despite our loss of the Senior Center kitchen staff. Matt Knip coordinates volunteers and three part-time kitchen aides. Jim Fields, our Super, works with the program and oversees clean-up and maintains order during open hours. Gen Savio maintains the inventory and Virginia Callahan serves as "hostess"! With other Lukan volunteers who come when they can (David Sitler, Tracey Brancifort, Greg Henry, and Elsie Reichert) and neighborhood volunteers, the program runs smoothly and efficiently. We continue also to serve on fourth Sundays at the Project FIND Coffee House at the bus terminal.

A beautiful Gospels Processional Book was dedicated to the Glory of God on All Saints Sunday, given in memory of ten Lukan brothers who have died of AIDS.

All of the above and more are possible because of our caring community of believers, our Lukan family. I'm profoundly grateful to you all for the love and encouragement you've given me during my twenty one years (today) as your pastor.

God bless us all as we seek only to give him glory and be useful in serving others in his Name!

- * We have been selected to host a recital for the National Convention of the American Guild of Organists this July.


These are all signs of an active, vital and healthy parish life made possible by everyone at St. Luke's.

The Ladies Aid Society

1995 Annual Report

In 1995 the Ladies Aid Society continued to carry on the same projects in which we have been involved for a number of years.

Our president, Marguerite Novak, is at home at the time of writing this report recuperating from surgery. We wish her a speedy recovery.

Campbell Company Labels - We sent 168 labels in 1995 to Bethesda Lutheran Home in Watertown, WI. From 1988 through 1995 we have sent in a total of 3,427 labels along with 20 plaid and Green Stamp Books. These are used towards acquisition of audiovisual equipment, library and computer-related items.

Canceled postage stamps - Please continue to save all stamps: foreign and U.S.A. These are used to raise money for foreign missions.

Eyeglasses - In February of 1995 we sent 24 pair of glasses to Eyes for the Needy in New Jersey. We do have a number on hand to be shipped shortly, and we would be happy to receive your old eyeglasses to include in this shipment.

Scott Company labels - We continue collecting UPC seals from Scott products. Scott Company pays 5 cents for each UPC received to Ronald McDonald Houses.

Tea Tag Program - Our president continues to make her trips to a Teaneck elementary school to give these tea tags to one of the lower grade classes which uses them as a learning experience as they count, sort and classify them.

We sold 6 cookbooks in 1995 bringing the total sold to 260. We have cookbooks for sale for \$12 each and which are usually on display at our Coffee Hour.

"With One Voice" hymnal supplement - The Ladies Aid has pledged \$1,000 toward the cost of the new hymnal supplement to be paid early in 1996. The Ladies Aid also assumed the cost of having 24 choir robes cleaned in the spring of 1995.

An offering basket is placed on our Coffee Hour table each Sunday to help defray the cost of coffee and any other expenses not borne by the Coffee Hour committees.

We had an Open House on Sunday, April 30th, 1995, to interest the ladies of our parish in joining our organization. As a result we are happy to report that we have added a few new members.

Our Annual June Luncheon was held at church. A wonderful assortment of food was provided by the ladies and Vicar Phillip Gaines cooked up a large pot of delicious chili which everyone enjoyed. More than 20 ladies were present at the luncheon.

We again cordially invite all ladies who are not members to attend our meetings which are held usually on the second Sunday of each month after the Coffee Hour. No meetings are held in July, August or September.

The Saint Luke's Ladies Aid Society will be 124 years old in May of 1996 and we are looking to another year of service to Saint Luke's, the community and the church at large.
